Dione started singing at the ripe age of 5 by copying the tones of Jimmy Barnes. it wasn't until she was 15 after hearing Charlotte Church that she discovered a joy of classical music. Soon after Dione fell in love with the beauty of opera. Dione has been performing since 2005 where she was in her first operetta with Salos(South Australian light opera society)

Notable roles include Michaela (Elephant in the room 2017)Suor Angelica (Co Opera, 2012/2013), Carlotta (Phantom of the Opera - Matt Byrne media 2013), Cio Cio San – Madame Butterfly (Co Opera 2015). In 2021 Dione was chosen to attend a 2 week opera intensive with the Mediterranean opera studio and festival, which, due to covid, became a virtual school. Dione made her chorus debut with state opera in 2009,

singing in numerous operas including the successful Carmen in the Square and La Boheme on the Beach.

Early music specialist, composer and conductor Anna has been singing for as long as she can remember. Starting at her Granny's knee. She has sung in dozens of choirs from around the world, including Christ's College Chapel Choir, Cambridge University Musical Society,

Adelaide Uni Choral Society, and the Adelaide Chamber Singers. She has also performed in several staged works with Cambridge Handel Opera Group, Cambridge University Opera

Society, and several times as soloist in Pucell's *Dido and Aeneas.* Anna has studied singing with a number of teachers

including Hilary Weiland, Keith Hempton, and Sally-Anne Russell. She has appeared as soloist in many recitals and performances, ranging from Hildegard of Bingen to

chamber music by Buxtehude and Purcell; oratorios by Bach and Handel; to contemporary Australian works.

Anna is the Founding Director of Adelaide's Lumina Vocal Ensemble (since 1999) and Lyrebyrd Consort (2008).

As well as leading the Lyrebyrd Viol Consort from her bass viol, Ellie also plays the rebec. Kenneth has been a musician as long as he can remember, playing a wide range of instruments from piano and clarinet, to guitar and recorder. He has also sung with dozens of choirs in Europe and Australia, including *Adelaide Chamber Singers, and as founding member of Lumina Vocal Ensemble*. A founding member of *Lyrebyrd Consort*, Kenneth has recently started learning the oud, and enjoys the chance to explore such an ancient instrument.

At University she sang in the combined St. Mark's and St. Ann's University College choir of 1971/2 and in a chorus with the Adelaide University Choral Society. A professional career in psychology, medical research and public health intervened, as did a PhD. After retirement in 2019, Klee was invited by Lyndon Piddington to join his 'Umbrella a Cappella' choir and has performed in all the concerts and public performances since then. During 2023 she also attended public workshops by 'The Gesualdo Six' and 'Sjaella', singing and learning from these international 'a cappella' ensembles. She enjoys musicals, jazz and especially five decades of Barbra Streisand recordings.

FIONA MCARDLE



SOPRANO

Fiona McArdle is an Adelaide local. After a childhood in Glenelg filled with choral singing at school and, what was then, Adelaide Girls Choir, Fiona made her way to the Elder Conservatorium where she finished with an Honours degree in Music Performance. In 2012 she made her debut with both Co-Opera and the State Opera of South Australia; as "La Principessa" in Co-Opera's performances of Puccini's Suor Angelica, and in the chorus of La Boheme with State Opera. Since then she has not looked back; working hard to improve her skills and find as many performance opportunities as possible. This led her to move to Boston in 2015 to study a Master of Music at the New England Conservatory of Music under the fabulous Wagnerian soprano Jane Eaglen (also known for her beautiful recordings of "The Dreame" and "Weep you no more" in Sense and Sensibility). In 2019, Fiona made her transition from mezzo to soprano official; making her role debut as "Mimi" in Hampstead Garden Opera's production of La Boheme. Since returning to Adelaide in 2020 Fiona has been growing her private teaching studio in Norwood, while also teaching for University of Adelaide's Open Music Academy, and, most recently, taking over as Convenor of the Adelaide Eisteddfod Vocal Division. Around this, Fiona has continued performing, appearing most recently in roles in the G&S Fest. As if all of this isn't enough, Fiona has also started a PhD at the Elder Conservatorium this year; undertaking research into Australian Art Song by women composers. Fiona's study of vocal pedagogy in the USA and subsequent work in London with Music Education Islington has fueled her passion to build mindful and supportive spaces for singers in Adelaide, for which CSS seems to be a perfect fit!
