

After a childhood in Glenelg filled with choral singing at school and, what was then, Adelaide Girls Choir, Fiona made her way to the Elder Conservatorium where she finished with an Honours degree in Music Performance. In 2012 she made her debut with both Co-Opera and State Opera South Australia; as "La Principessa" in Co-Opera's performances of Puccini's Suor Angelica, and in the chorus of La Boheme with State Opera. Since then she has not looked back; working hard to improve her skills and find as many performance opportunities as possible. This led her to move to Boston in 2015 to study a Master of Music at the New England Conservatory of Music under the fabulous Wagnerian soprano Jane Eaglen (also known for her beautiful recordings of "The Dreame" and "Weep you no more" in Sense and Sensibility). Since returning to Adelaide in 2020 Fiona has been growing her private teaching studio in Norwood, and volunteering as Convenor of the Adelaide Eisteddfod Vocal Division. Around this, Fiona has continued performing, appearing most recently in roles in the G&S Fest and the chorus of Macbeth and Marriage of Figaro. As if all of this isn't enough, Fiona is also working on a PhD at the Elder Conservatorium; undertaking research into Australian Art Song by women composers of the 21st century.

Kendall Geisler


