Jessica Mills

Soprano Jessica Mills holds a Bachelor of Musical Theatre from the Queensland Conservatorium. Performing in Australia and overseas, she was recently seen at the Sydney Opera House in Sweeney Todd: the Demon Barber of Fleet Street, and in the national broadcast of the 2023 Carols by Candlelight. This year, Jessica starred in State Opera South Australia's Opera In The Pub series, and was the only Australian performer in the Semi-Finals of the prestigious Lotte Lenya Competition in New York.

Jamie Moffatt — Baritone



Jamie studied at the Elder Conservatorium from 2007-2009, was a principal baritone of Co-Opera's national touring program from 2009-2017, and toured internationally in 'The Marriage of Figaro', 'Acis and Galatea', and 'Die Fledermaus.'

In 2013 Jamie joined The Australian Voices, performing in the off-Broadway première of 'Boombox'; the national tour of the choral opera 'MOON' as one of six singers headlining the 'La Voix Du Sud' festival in New Caledonia in 2013 and premièring Natalie Weir's Everyday Requiem in 2018.

Jamie has been a member of the chorus of State Opera South Australia since 2010 and has performed the roles of Mad Hatter in 'Boojum!' II Commisionario in 'La Traviata' and Bob Beckett in 'HMS Pinafore.' They have regularly performed in the Adelaide Festival chorus since 2020, and in 2017 they founded Elephant in the Room Productions.

Mostly recently you may have seen them as Dr Dulcamara in Co-Operas the Elixir of love and Manawydan in the curse of Dyved

Since returning to Australia from the UK in late 2017, Michele has divided her time between Adelaide and Melbourne, singing in cathedral and church choirs in both cities, and in the auditioned chorus of the MSO. For the 2018 Adelaide Festival Fringe she formed her own eight voice women's ensemble, "Sacred Hearts", who perform Renaissance convent music. In 2021, with the South Australian borders closed because of the pandemic, she performed her first solo role in a musical, in "Into the Woods" - in the woods!

She is currently preparing to sing the role of Queen Rhiannon in the chamber opera "The curse on Dyved" in the 2024 Adelaide Fringe.



Samuel Coleridge-Taylor

Coleridge -Taylor was born in London to Alice Hare Martin, and Daniel Peter Hughes Taylor, a Krio man from Sierra Leone who had studied medicine in London and later became an administrator in West Africa. They were not married, and Daniel had returned to Africa without learning that Alice was pregnant. Alice named her son Samuel Coleridge Taylor (without a hyphen), after the poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge He later used the name "Samuel Coleridge-Taylor", with a hyphen, said to be following a printer's error.

His notable works include 'Hiawatha's Wedding Feast' (1898), 'The Death of Minnehaha' (1899), and 'Hiawatha's Departure' (1900). They received popular acclaim rivalled that of Handel's Messiah' and Mendelssohn's 'Elijah'. The Hiawatha trilogy was popular with British choirs and orchestras.
