Alexandra Woolston



Meran Bow is a South Australian contralto. Meran completed a Bachelor of Education in Secondary Drama, before beginning private vocal studies, firstly with Carol Kohler and then Florin Radulescu.

Meran joined the State Opera SA chorus in 1992 and was a member of the Young Artist Program in 1997. Principal roles with the company include, Mrs Partlett (The Sorcerer), Third Lady (The Magic Flute), Babet (La Chanson de Fortunio), Pitti-Sing (The Mikado), The Mother (Mavra), The Woman (Riders to the Sea). She has covered the roles of Grimgerde (Die Walkure), Marcellina, (The Marriage of Figaro), Dorabella (Cosi Fan Tutte), Mrs Grose (Turn of the Screw) among others.

In 2015 she made her debut with Co Opera singing Azucena in Il Trovatore. Later, she toured regional Australia, performing the roles of Madame Larina and Filippevna in Eugene Onegin. Meran also sang the role of Zita(Gianni Schicchi) in 2022 for Co-Opera and La Zia Principessa (Suor Angelica) for Mopoke Productions. For the G & Samp; S Society, she has appeared as Kate (The Pirates of Penzance), Katisha (The Mikado), Fairy Queen (Iolanthe) and Lady Blanche (Princess Ida). Meran has extensive concert credits having sung as alto soloist for the Norwood Symphony Orchestra, Adelaide University Choral Society, Adelaide Youth Orchestra, The Accompanist's Guild, Harmony Choir and The Adelaide Hills Chamber players.

Mia Luppino -emerging artist-




But once a year it glows with power the blessed angels on holy night. The Christ child lights lots of lights, Father Christmas brings them to us at the Christmas tree.

Most recently playing Lady Sangazure (The Sorcerer) with SA Light Opera Society She has also performed with numerous choral groups and performances including Vivace Singers, Hills Chamber Players, The Corinthian Singers, Agape Voices and Sacred Hearts Jemimah is a proud member of the Classical Singer Sundays Committee. Outside of singing she likes watching period dramas (mostly Austen), spending time with her family (including her two corgis) and watching obscure decades old sitcoms.

Fiona McArdle

Fiona is an Adelaide local. After a childhood in Glenelg filled with choral singing at school and, what was then, Adelaide Girls Choir, Fiona made her way to the Elder Conservatorium where she finished with an Honours degree in Music Performance. In 2012 she made her debut with both Co-Opera and State Opera South Australia; as "La Principessa" in Co-Opera's performances of Puccini's Suor Angelica, and in the chorus of La Boheme with State Opera. Since then she has not looked back; working hard to improve her skills and find as many performance opportunities as possible. This led her to move to Boston in 2015 to study a Master of Music at the New England Conservatory of Music under the fabulous Wagnerian soprano Jane Eaglen (also known for her beautiful recordings of "The Dreame" and "Weep you no more" in Sense and Sensibility). Since returning to Adelaide in 2020 Fiona has been growing her private teaching studio in Norwood, and volunteering as Convenor of the Adelaide Eisteddfod Vocal Division. Around this, Fiona has continued performing, appearing most recently in roles in the G&S Fest and the chorus of Macbeth and Marriage of Figaro. In May 2025 Fiona will be appearing as Minkswoman in Jonathon Doves Flight with State Opera of South Australia.



Starting musicals in 2022, before Danielle Ruggiero-Prior (with help from Jemimah Lanyon) dragged him into the classical scene late last year! A debt yet to be repayed....

Catherine Campbell

Catherine is an actor, singer, director and educator. Her credits include performances in Australia and New York in cabaret, as well as musical theatre, opera, comedy, showbands and theatre. Catherine is a member of the State Opera of SA Chorus, appearing recently in the co-production of Candide with State Theatre Company, and has also sung minor principal roles; and performed in operas with Co-Opera and Various People, as well as for the Adelaide Festival including Barrie Kosky's Saul, and most recently Robert Lepage's The Nightingale and Other Tales. In 2024 Catherine was nominated for an Adelaide Critics Circle Award for her performance as Mrs Custance in A Cheery Soul (Holden Street Theatre Company). As a much-loved cabaret artist, Catherine has performed many times in the Adelaide Cabaret Festival: as a solo artist, and with her trio Gentlemen Prefer Curves, as well as in shows with Andrew Lippa, Jason Robert-Brown and Maltby & Shire. She created the character of Greta in the award-winning Berlin Cabaret, and co-wrote My Blue Angel with Frank Ford, touring to New York and in Australia. SA Premiere roles include: The Witch, Into The Woods (Space Theatre); Mimi, A New Brain (Davine Productions). She once sang backing vocals for Split Enz and has never quite gotten over it. Catherine is a teaching academic at UniSA in Performing Arts (unique in Australia: experiential learning in theatre and music with no auditions). Training: Acting (AC Arts), Musical Theatre Honours, Drama Centre (Flinders); International Cabaret School, Yale (USA).

In 1976 Jeffrey Kong began a distinguished career of 40 years as a music educator at Brighton Secondary (High) School eventually taking up the position of Head of Music. During his tenure he led staff and students on many music tours in Australia and to Asia and Europe where students performed in some of the world's finest concert halls, conservatoriums and cathedrals. His most memorable performance being in the Pantheon in Rome. His long-held dream of a concert hall for Brighton Secondary School was fulfilled in 2014 with the opening of the "Jeffrey Kong" Auditorium". Jeffrey retired from Brighton Secondary School at the end of 2015. Upon his retirement Jeffrey continued to contribute to music education at William Light School (2016), a bilingual school in English and Chinese and then at Wilderness School (2017/2018) one of the finest schools for young ladies in Australia. Jeffrey also taught music at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music and was repetiteur at the Sydney Conservatorium Opera School Jeffrey continued to study throughout his career. Through a Cultural Grant-Scholarship he studied at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, followed by further studies at Adelaide University, University of Southern California, USA and with an Italian National Scholarship at the Rossini Conservatorium, Pesaro, Italy. Jeffrey is passionate about learning languages, and he currently undertakes studies and training in several European and Asian languages. Since the lock down in 2020 he reignited his passion for church music. He is currently studying organ with Ashleigh Tobin and plays for services at Scots Church, Adelaide and is Music Director at St Augustine's Church, Unley.
