

South Australian soprano Danielle Ruggiero-Prior's career spans over 30 years and has seen her perform in opera, musical theatre, corporate stages, film, and as a concert soloist. She graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Music in Voice Performance

Danielle joined the State Opera of South Australia Chorus in 1999 and has also been a member of the Adelaide Festival Chorus. Most recently, she was a featured soloist in Passionate Puccini, and in the State Opera Chorus of Lucia Di Lammermoor

FRIKIE JACOBS

Starting later in life after short stint in the Cape Town
Philharmonia Chorus in 2011, Frikkie started singing seriously
again in 2014. He sang with SALOS in two shows that year
(Lilac Time and The Sorcerer), and has been a grateful
regular with CSS. Since 2025 he has been singing with
Adelaide Philharmonia Chorus.

Now for a kiss of yours I throw away a treasure!





member since 1997; various minor principal roles); roles with
Co*Opera and Various People.

Teaching: UniSA Performing Arts (SA's only non-auditioned experiential performing arts course); Elder Conservatorium;
Ballarat Academy of Performing Arts; lead vocal tutor in
Adelaide Festival Centre's OnStage Performing Arts program.
Catherine once sang backing vocals for Split Enz and has never quite gotten over it.







Kingsley is a Year 5 student with a passion for singing and music. He has been studying voice for four years and is currently a member of the St Peter's Cathedral Choir, where he receives vocal training under the direction of Anthony Hunt.

Kingsley enjoys performing sacred music and classical repertoire, and he is continually developing his vocal technique and musical expression through regular rehearsals and performances with the choir.

In 2025, he competed in the Adelaide Eisteddfod vocal competition and was awarded both a Third Place and an Honourable Mention for his performances. These achievements have further encouraged him to pursue his musical interests with dedication.



and Pitti Sing in The Mikado.





Ros loves funny dogs, and gelati.



However, with a strong need to scream/sing out her feelings and a deep commitment to pleasing people, here she is. Amelia will be performing Laurie's Song from Copland's The Tenderland. If you're wondering what this has to do with partying or being a "party piece", Amelia doesn't know. From this we can only assume that parties must include: a pretty piano accompaniment, excitement for what's to come, a touch of existential crisis and a sustained high note at the end. Sounds like a party to me!

Jamie Lynn Webster is a performer, teacher, and scholar in both classical and ethnographic music genres. Alongside her training and studies in historical European traditions, she has spent over twenty five years learning related folk singing traditions from the far corners of Europe and the Balkans. As a Masters and PhD student in Musicology and Ethnomusicology, she studied with preeminent Romany and East European scholars/performers Carol Silverman and Mark Levy, and learned privately and in Master class settings with several internationally recognised performers (in European, as well as other world traditions). Jamie's training and experiences from research travels often informs her work conducting choirs performing choral music from around the world; the two pieces performed today reflect solo repertoire learned from her travels.
