



Jamie Lynn Webster received her bachelor degrees cum laude in vocal performance and music education from California State University Chico before relocating to Chicago, performing there in the Lira Ensemble, North America's only professional Polish Arts ensemble, and the prestigious professional arts choir, the Chicago Choral Artists. She received M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Oregon in musical folklore, musicology and ethnomusicology, specialising in music for drama and cultural identity in stage and film productions. In Eugene, Oregon, she performed with Kef Balkan ensemble and Fossegrimen Scandinavian Ensemble, among others, and in Portland, Oregon, directed a number of choirs and institutional ensembles, including the Welsh Dragon Choir and Ensemble, and ViVoce Women's World Music Choir. She is the author of publications on Balkan singing traditions in diaspora, dance performance as reflection of cultural ideology and identity, and topics of adaptation theory and metaphor theory in Harry Potter film music. In Adelaide, Jamie continues her work as a director, performer, teacher, and scholar, leading music as organist and vocalist for St. Augustine's Anglican Church, tutoring piano students at Pedare College, and coaching choirs around the city.

Catherine is a member of the State Opera of SA Chorus, appearing recently in the co-production of Candide with State Theatre Company, and has also sung minor principal rolesincluding Praskovia in Merry Widow; Cora The Boots in Boojum!. Catherine has performed roles in operas with Co*Opera and Various People, and for the Adelaide Festival including Barrie Kosky's Saul and Robert Lepage's The Nightingale and Other Tales.

As a much-loved cabaret artist, she's performed many times in the Adelaide Cabaret Festival: as a solo artist, and with her trio Gentlemen Prefer Curves, as well as in shows with Andrew Lippa, Jason Robert-Brown and Maltby & Shire. She created the character of Greta in the award-winning Berlin Cabaret, and co-wrote My Blue Angel with Frank Ford, touring to New York and in Australia. SA Premiere roles include: The Witch, Into The Woods (Space Theatre, AFC); Mimi, A New Brain (Davine Productions). In 2024 she was nominated for an Adelaide Critics Circle Award for A Cheery Soul at Holden Street Theatres (Mrs Custance). She once sang backing vocals for Split Enz and has never quite gotten over it.

Catherine is a teaching academic at UniSA in Performing Arts (unique in Australia: experiential learning in theatre and music with no auditions).



Klee is a mezzo-soprano with a three-and-a-half octave range. As a child she was selected for the South Australian Public Primary Schools choir which performed in the Adelaide Town Hall. In 1971/2 at University she sang in the combined St. Mark's and St. Ann's University Colleges choir and in a chorus with Adelaide University Choral Society for a recital by Guila Tiver conducted by Richard Divall in the Elder Hall. A professional career in psychology, medical research and public health intervened, as did a PhD. After retiring in 2019, Klee was invited by Lyndon Piddington to join his choir 'Umbrella a Cappella' and performed with them for six years until 2024, leaving to perform solo.

During 2023 Klee had a solo classical singing debut performing the Handel aria 'Lascia Ch'io Pianga' at the second 'Classical Singer Sundays' concert. She has participated in 'a cappella' workshops with international ensembles 'The Gesualdo Six', 'Sjaella', 'Voces 8' and 'Nobuntu'. Klee was in the chorus for 'Big Sing on Broadway' in 2024 and is rehearsing for 'Big Sing at the Opera' in 2025. She also sang solo in 2025 at 'Broadway Sessions'. She enjoys musicals, jazz and especially six decades of Barbra Streisand recordings.

In 2013 Jamie joined The Australian Voices, performing in the off-Broadway première of 'Boombox'; the national tour of the choral opera 'MOON' as one of six singers headlining the 'La Voix Du Sud' festival in New Caledonia in 2013 and premièring Natalie Weir's Everyday Requiem in 2018.

Jamie has been a member of the chorus of State Opera South Australia since 2010 and has performed the roles of Mad Hatter in 'Boojum!' Il Commisionario in 'La Traviata' and Bob Beckett in 'HMS Pinafore. They have regularly performed in the Adelaide Festival chorus since 2020, won 2 gold medals and two world championship trophies as a member of the Festival Statesmen Chorus at the 2024 World Choir Games, and in 2017 they founded Elephant in the Room Productions

She'll soon be performing in Chitty Chitty Bang Bang as the Toymaker and Glass Houses as Harper. From theatre to classical, Poppy is a young performer growing her voice and her story.


I'm Elizabeth Ponce, I'm a Mexican soprano with more than ten years of experience singing opera, although my only experience since I arrived to Australia one year ago, has been picking and packing fertilizer (of the best quality by the way) in a company full of the best people ever.

I sang roles like Gilda, from Rigoletto, Madama Butterfly, Sour Angelica, Contessa from Le nozze di Figaro, and others, in countries like USA, Panama, Peru, Spain and Austria.

TRANSLATION

It's the old tale of the shepherd... The poor boy wanted to retell it And he fell asleep. There is oblivion in sleep. How I envy him! BJ's involvement in singing began in church and school choirs, musicals and light opera, with an earlier musical foundation in piano as a student of Vera Tancibudek and later vocal studies with Michelle Grieg. After forays into folk, blues, jazz, aleatory and improvisation, a return to South Australia from NSW in 2000 led to a renewed interest in the classical tradition of choral singing, lieder and art song.

BJ has sung with a range of South Australian ensembles, including the Gilbert & Sullivan Society, the Adelaide Philharmonia Chorus, Elephant in the Room Productions, the Corinthian Singers, Elder Chorale, St Peter's Consort, and with St Peter's Cathedral Choir in the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra's 2024 'Harmony' Concert. In April of this year he was a soloist in the Adelaide Philharmonia Chorus' presentation of 'Magical Mozart'. Since 2022 BJ has been a member of Lumina Vocal Ensemble, a group specialising in Medieval and Renaissance masterworks, Australian contemporary compositions and choral treasures from around the globe.

In 2022, Tahlia permanently relocated with her young family back to her hometown of Adelaide. Having lived in Melbourne from 2017 – 2022, she has performed operas with companies such as Cordelia's Potted Opera (Suor Angelica), BK Opera (Abduction from the Seraglio, White Night Melbourne & Bendigo, Pierette et Jacquot, Orphée et Euridice, & La Scala di Seta) Melbourne Opera (H.M.S Pinafore, The Flying Dutchman, Norma & Fidelio) and Lyster Opera (L'Elisir d'Amore).

Since returning to Adelaide, Tahlia has established Tahlia Murphy Voice Studio. With over 15 years of voice teaching experience, it is her goal to create a nurturing and supportive environment for her voice students. To empower voices with correct technique and foster passion for the joy that naturally comes with singing is her mission. Tahlia has also enjoyed returning to performing in The Pirates of Penzance and H.M.S Pinafore with Emma Knights Productions and L'Elisir d'Amore with Co-Opera.

HELENA DIX

PERFORMING SUMMERTIME G. GERSHWIN

Helena Dix FRAM is an Australian soprano whose vocal cords are registered as a national treasure and possibly a minor weather event. A dazzling blend of vocal fireworks and theatrical flair, she has conquered the great opera stages of the world-including The Met, Seattle, Garsington and La Monnaie armed with nothing but a 40-pound gown, a love for high notes, and a mischievous disregard for what composers actually wrote. Known for her obsession with singing notes that only dogs and dolphins can truly appreciate, Dix is infamous for "adding" her own decorative squiggles to scores-because why sing only a high C when you can invent an ornament or six? Her frock collection, estimated to weigh more than a small horse, is as legendary as her top notes, and she's been known to smuggle props home from rehearsals in her ample bosom. Despite her vocal pyrotechnics and diva-worthy entrances, Helena is adored for her down-to-earth humor and ability to belt out impossibly high notes while making it look like she's just ordering a coffee. Critics agree: she's part Bel Canto warhorse, part fairy princess, and all glorious mayhem. When Helena Dix sings, scores tremble, chandeliers shiver, and audiences rise-probably out of sheer astonishment or the need to stretch after all the embellishments.
